George Schricker has written over 500 songs and has produced nine albums of his original works. He has performed in libraries and schools around the country and in Canada and at festivals and museums, including The Field Museum in Chicago and the Indianapolis Children's Museum.

George has presented his storytelling method, *The Story Inside* in 48 artist residencies and in numerous institutional settings, including Indiana University School of Education in Bloomington, Indiana. He holds an Interdepartmental Studies degree from Northwestern University and an MFA in Writing from Spalding University in Louisville, Kentucky.



The Story Inside

Prepare to laugh, draw, move, listen, vocalize, drum, play intensely and entertain silence.

During this three-day storytelling experience, participants will create their own personal fairy tale and learn the performance skills needed to effectively narrate it.

George's method (based on tribal sensitivities and the work of Psychologist, Carl Jung) makes use of the natural gifts inherent within each person's unconscious mind. This process is designed to create harmony and empathy within ourselves and amongst others, nurturing the concepts of inner and therefore world peace.

The method has proven useful for:

Developing public speaking skills by enhancing the integration of voice and gesture thereby enabling one to feel more comfortable presenting in front of others.

Deepening the understanding of the relationship between self and soul, while helping to resolve and perceive inner conflicts.



Sensitizing one to the efficacy of group dynamic, **understanding the group as a potential healing principle.**

Apprehending the core healing principles inherent in the artistic process, **seeing the arts as essential to the health of the individual and the community.**

Each day will be filled with a new experience.

An Introduction on Friday evening will begin the process.

Saturday will be spent developing each person's story.

Saturday night will be spent in rehearsals.

Sunday morning each story will be told and celebrated.

During the process participants are encouraged to spend time in silence, prayer, or meditation. Explore the beauty of the PHJC Ministry Center grounds.
